He has served on various other committees and Boards for BRUN (Berkeley-Regis United Neighbors) and INC (Inter-Neighborhood Cooperation).

Joan has been our Membership Chair and has increased the number of paid members. Joan has been Tom's sounding board and secretary, and has hosted numerous events at their home. Thank you, Tom and Joan for all you have done and will continue to do for HH.

HHNA Annual Meeting Recap

On May 11, we gathered with many of our neighbors for our annual HHNA meeting at the Denver Police Department District 1 station. Thank you, Tocabe, An American Indian Eatery, for providing a delicious buffet!

Two board positions were open. The nominating committee submitted Vice President Roberta Andersen for the open slot of President, and Laura Sprengelmeyer agreed to remain as Treasurer for another two-year term. Roberta and Laura were then approved by the members present. Justin Wilson was approved to be the new Vice President. Laura presented the HHNA budget for 2019, which also was approved.

HHNA Design Overlay Update

At the annual meeting, Rafael Espinoza, our now former City Councilman, and Tom Mobley presented an update on our Design Overlay. Our application for the overlay has been filed and accepted and is being actively worked on by the Denver Community Planning and Development Department. The total process will take longer than we had hoped because of normal bureaucratic and legislative requirements and steps. Tom, Greg Sader, Joan Mobley, Peggy Lentz, Mollie O'Brian, and Rafael have met twice with the Planning Department project team. Meetings will continue, with our new City Councilwoman Amanda Sandoval taking Rafael's place. It is anticipated that final adoption of the overlay will be in Winter/Spring 2020.

Crime Prevention

Between March and May of this year, there were six vehicles break-in Harkness Heights; four were license plate thefts and two were UNLOCKED vehicles. All were easily preventable. Stop by the District One Police Station at 1311 W 46th St, and they will replace, for free, your license plate screws with ones that cannot be removed without a special tool. It only takes a few minutes. Always lock your vehicles doors, even in the garage, and remove all valuables.
