Neighborhood Watch Meeting Recap

Many of our neighbors met with representatives from the Denver Police Department on March 23rd. Catherine Davis, our Neighborhood Watch Liaison, and Officer Michele Cooper, our Community Resource Officer, spoke on the importance of the Neighborhood Watch (NW) Program. Our NW has helped keep our crime rate relatively low, but more help is needed. The #1 deterrent of crime is porch lights or motion-sensor lights. To prevent porch pirates, see if there is a better way to hide packages on the porch, such as behind a big planter.

Smart 911. When you call 911 from a mobile phone, the operator only has your phone number and a general location. Signing up for Smart911 provides 911 and emergency responders with important information about you for use in an emergency.
