HHNA Design/Conservation Overlay Update

Our Harkness Heights Neighborhood Association (HHNA) Overlay project has continued to make great progress since our November Newsletter update. Two Harkness Heights Conservation Overlay Town Hall meetings were hosted by Councilwoman Amanda Sandoval this spring at Skinner Middle School. The meetings were well attended and included lively discussions on the proposed overlay.

As a follow up to the meetings, all HH property owners were invited to provide their thoughts and opinions of the proposed overlay through a Survey Monkey survey. A total of 211 survey responses were received out of 360 total properties in HH, an amazing 59 percent participation. Clearly Harkness Heights is an engaged neighborhood with residents who took advantage of the opportunity to have their voices heard on the future of our neighborhood.

Overall, the survey responses were strongly in support of the overlay. Detailed analysis of responses showed that some elements needed further study and possible adjustment. The Overlay Task Force and Naomi Grunditz, staff member to Councilwoman Sandoval, worked to adjust the proposed overlay based on the analysis of the responses to the neighborhood-wide survey. These adjustments will be added to the overlay proposal and then submitted to Brad Johnson and his team at Denver's Community Planning and Development Department (CPD). Councilwoman Sandoval will direct the CPD to create a draft of the overlay in the technical language of the zoning code for submission to the Planning Board and City Council for review, public hearings, and approval.

Special thanks to all our neighbors who have been so involved in this process and have shared their thoughts and opinions of the value on an overlay for the benefit of our neighborhood.

The Northside Sustainability Alliance is a new organization that was founded to share resources and ideas about sustainability among the various organizations and businesses in Denver's Northside neighborhoods. The Alliance has 5 areas of focus: Zero Waste, Transportation, Green Energy, Tree Planting / Gardening, Smart Growth. I am the (self-designated) representative for HHNA, but this organization will only thrive and make a difference through the active participation of many. My particular interest in the Sustainability Alliance is with Zero Waste, focusing on composting and recycling. Trash, and especially plastics, end up in our air and water with detrimental effects to the health of animals and people. There are many things we can do to reduce the amount of trash that goes to the landfill. Hopefully everyone is already using the purple bins for recycling with the city of Denver, but it is also important to ensure that you are using the bins correctly. For starters, NO plastic bags of any kind are allowed in the bins. They gum up the sorting machinery and put recycling workers at risk when they have to clean it out. Please refer to the City of Denver website for detailed recycling guideline to prevent 'wishcycling'! Composting is also a great way to reduce the waste in landfills, either through the City of Denver green bins or your own backyard composting. Our family went from filling a large trashcan every week to now using only half of the smallest can. It makes a big difference!

There are other items that are harder to recycle. The attached table has some helpful tips on keeping items out of the landfill.
